01 CITATION STYLES CHANGE...

Citation styles, including APA, get revised occasionally. This infographic will be for APA 7, so make sure to double check that style 7 is the most recent!

02 TITLE PAGE REQUIREMENTS

- legible font
- title is centered and in bold
- three spaces below the title, add your name, university, course name and number, professor's name, and the date the assignment is due (each on different lines)
- double-spaced

03 RUNNING HEAD

- top right-hand corner of every page
- page number is needed

04 ABSTRACT REQUIREMENTS

- some professors do not require them
- on the new page below the title page
- the word abstract must be bolded and centered at the top of the page
- short summary, roughly 250 words, about your paper



05 IN-TEXT CITATIONS

(Author's Last Name, Year Published, Page Number)

Example: (Jonson, 2015, p. 12)



06 REFERENCE LIST

At the end of each paper, you should have a list of sources cited in APA format. This should look like:

- the word "References" centered and bolded
- sources in alphabetical order
- a hanging indent

Lastname, First Initial. Middle Initial. & Lastname, First Initial. Middle Initial. (Year, Month Date).
Title of article. *Title of Periodical*, Vol. (Issue), page numbers. DOI or URL

+ | NO AUTHOR OR NO DATE

If you happen to use a source that either doesn't have an author or doesn't have a date, there is an easy fix in your in-text citations and references.

No Author:

- replace the author with the title

(Title, Year, Page)

No Date:

- replace the date with n.d.

(Title, n.d., Page)
