

COMMUNITY NEED





School Ratings: Based on the latest available state assessment data, no school in the Elkhart Community Schools (ECS) district is A-rated. Over 70% of all schools in ECS are rated C, D, or F.

State Assessments: Low school ratings are also reflected in proficiency scores for these schools on the most recent state summative assessment, ILEARN.

ELA Proficiency: Across the state, the ELA proficiency rate for all students was 48%, while across all ECS schools, the scholar proficiency rate for ELA was notably lower than the state, at 32%.



Math Proficiency: Across the state, the math proficiency rate for all students was 48%, while across all ECS schools, the scholar proficiency rate for math was notably lower than the state, at 33%. Personalized **Instruction** & Integrated **Technology**

OUR TRACK RECORD OF SUCCESS

Transformed six (6) F-rated schools to A-rated schools in Indiana (4 in Indianapolis, 1 in Fort Wayne, 1 in Merrillville).

Increased scholar passing rates on the state ELA and Math tests by 11% in just one year – the highest standardized test growth for all schools in Central Indiana.



Earned school rankings of #4 and #5 in the district for strongest growth (with 8.2% and 8.1% increases in state test score proficiency growth, respectively.



Accelerated progress towards grade-level proficiency with 72% of scholars showing standard to high annual growth on the state test.



Achieved an average of 92% passing on the state third grade reading exam at our founding school.

OUR CORE CURRICULUM





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Reading: PLA will use Houghton Mifflin Harcourt's (HMH) Into Reading for grades K-5 and Into Literature for grades 6-8 as well as grades 9-12.

Literacy Intervention: We will utilize Fountas & Pinnell (F&P) Leveled Literacy Intervention (LLI), a powerful, short-term intervention, that provides daily, intensive, small-group instruction.

Math: PLA has plans to adopt the Eureka Math curriculum for grades K-8. The curriculum is state standards-aligned, provides regular assessments for teachers to implement frequent checks for understanding.

High School Curriculum: Programs and curricula choices for the high school are made to align with state standards and Indiana HS Graduation Requirements and will be reassessed ahead of the high school launch planned for 2025.

Edgenuity: The Edgenuity Learning Management System works in tandem with the aforementioned curriculum at PLA to support the implementation of blended personalized learning.

Individualized Learning Pathways


OUR COACHING CYLCE

The PLA Instructional Review Process provides proactive academic support for each of our tier 2 and 3 network schools and scholars. Instructional reviews are conducted by members of PLA's National and Regional Academic Teams and seek alignment with PLA's Academic Priorities for Success which includes six specialized training areas as well as an array of tools for schools and school leaders to grow and develop.

CLIMATE AND CULTURE

Fostering a Positive Learning Environment



Having a school that is safe, loving and nurturing is critical to the success of scholars.



We conduct a review and refinement of the schoolwide behavior management plans and enhance those plans by implementing our PBIS system.



In similar schools, after the first month of use, our schools positivity ratio was 71% and the following month the ratio increased to 75%.



The PLA Coaching Cycle (Domain 1 & 2) and Institute, our training portal, also support teachers in effective classroom and behavior management.

BUGDET NARRATIVE



The budget is a conservative view of enrollment, revenue and expenses. Competitive Grants & Philanthropic support are required in years 1-3 to support establishing the school and the initial years of operation.

- Community engagement, marketing and school performance will support annual enrollment growth.
- State basic funding is also conservatively projected at current levels and held constant for all years of the model.
- Staffing is based on current average salaries and benefits plus an allowance for 3% annual increases.
- Staff ratios are based on 25 scholars per class.
- Facility lease costs are based on research and experience.
- All expenses are aligned to funding available based on annual enrollment.
