## Mission and Vision of the Organization

Briefly describe the mission and vision of the organization and how this model addresses innovation in education.

Mission: Through STEM-focused and real-world experiences, we empower students to create the world they envision by developing the minds of creative problem-solvers and skilled achievers.

Vision: We aspire to create a world of equity where every student has the opportunity and access to achieve their goals and to realize their power to solve problems they encounter.

Innovation: In the traditional high school setting, it is easy to predict, with a high level of accuracy, the outcomes for low-income and underrepresented minority students regardless of school type. The driving force for Purdue Polytechnic High School (PPHS) was to create a high school designed to create different outcomes. This meant questioning every aspect of the typical high school, and the result has been a school that approaches learning truly differently. Everything we do is focused on the student experience. Students learn through authentic projects with local industry partners to solve real problems using the design thinking process. Students are given control over which projects they participate in and are given a voice and choice in all aspects of their education. By taking a radically different approach to high school, we plan to change the trajectory of students who otherwise may not matriculate to a postsecondary experience or high paying technical job. To that end, students who meet admission requirements earn direct admission to all colleges within Purdue University.
