While we are always enthusiastic about opening a new school, we recognize that at times, it may be necessary to delay a school’s proposed start date. Due to delays in facility procurement the start date for Purdue Polytechnic High School West will be moved to Fall 2025. Assuming there are no material changes in the approved application for charter authorization between now and then, your charter term of seven years will be unaffected, with a beginning date of June 30, 2025.

It is evident that the applicant team is committed to offering a high-quality educational option to families in Indiana, with a clear vision and mission for achieving success. We are optimistic about the team’s capacity to execute this proposal and look forward to our continued collaboration and partnership in the future.
