Accreditation Process

The Center for Montessori Education at Trine University (CMETU) is in its initial year and is dedicated to Montessori authenticity and best practices, as well as all of the high standards upheld in the Franks School of Education and Trine University.

The Center for Montessori Education is also an applicant in good standing with the accrediting body, Montessori Accreditation Council for Teacher Education (MACTE), and has highly qualified faculty of experienced professionals from within the region, representing both public and private Montessori schools.

The affiliation and accreditation process requires a lengthy self-study, takes up to two years from inception, and includes the involvement of the founding cohort of students. The timeline established by MACTE involves completion of the self-study and on-site accreditation visit prior to the completion and graduation of the first cohort of the program. CMETU adheres to standards and requirements established by the American Montessori Society (AMS), though in no way does that suggest AMS affiliation at this time.
