About Trine

- Private university in Northeast Indiana (Angola)
 - Schools
 - 7 Schools and almost 40 different Majors and Minors
 - Allen School of Engineering and Computing, College of Health Professions, Franks School of Education, Jannen School of Arts & Sciences, Ketner School of Business, Rinker-Ross School of Health Sciences, Trine Online
 - Student Body
 - About 2,300 students on campus with another 3,000 world wide
 - Representing 39 states and 30 different countries
 - Almost 50% of the student body are athletes of some kind basketball, hockey, football, baseball/softball, track, golf (*we even have a golf management major*)
 - After Graduation
 - Over 99% of graduates were either employed or enrolled in grad school 6 months after graduation



Benefits to Dual Enrollment:

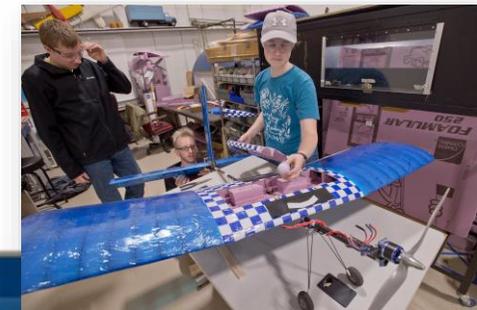
Benefits

- Drastically **reduced costs** over the standard cost of a college course
- Prepares you to **transition** into the world of college
- **Challenges you** academically by raising the level of expectations
- **Credits** earned will transfer on the [Core Transfer Library \(CTL\)](#)
 - Means if the course we are offering is on the CTL if you earn it with us, it will transfer across Indiana to any public university

Trine Dual Enrollment Options:

- Academic Experience
- Campus Experience
- Online Experience
 - Three options
 - Online - Asynchronous
 - Online – Blended (formerly known as guided)



Academic Experience

- Also known as the concurrent enrollment model
- Courses are taught in the HS setting with the certified HS Dual Enrollment teacher
- The HS Dual Enrollment Teacher will provide a parallel learning experience that the HS students would receive if they were attending college.
- \$25 per credit hour

Campus

- Students will come to the Trine campus to take the course they desire.
- Students are taught by Trine instructors.
- Experience Campus life
- Immediate access to support services provided by Trine
- \$95 per credit hour

Online Experience - 2 options

- **Online – Asynchronous**
 - Students are placed in an 8-week online course
 - Courses are taught online by Trine's professors through our Learning Management System (*LMS*) Moodle
 - \$50 per credit hour
 - This is a great option for:
 - Individual students with openings in their schedule
 - Homeschooled Students
 - Instructors who do not have HLC's required credentials and have a small number of students

Online Experience

- **Online - Blended** (formerly known as guided)
 - Students will take this course with fellow classmates of 20 or more students
 - 16-week models are available
 - The first half is frontloaded by the HS instructor to prepare students for the rigor of the college class.
 - The second half is taught by Trine's professors through our Learning Management System (*LMS*) Moodle
 - \$33 per credit hour
 - This is a great option for:
 - Large class that can take the dual enrollment course together
 - Instructors who are familiar with the content, but do not have HLC's required credentials.

Highschool Year-long Course Timeline

Fall Semester
Begins
(August)

- Students are officially registered and enrolled in Trine Course for Term 2 in late October

(August – January)

- **Classroom Teacher**
 - Goal: Prepare students for their DE course by previewing content and learning objectives
 - Access to Moodle Course shell
 - Can view assessments, assignments, content, and learning objectives
 - Uses the shell to create their own locally created version of the class
 - Lectures, assignments, assessments, content, etc.
 - The classroom teacher has ownership of this portion of the course

Spring Semester
Begins
(January)

- Trine Spring Term Begins
 - Students start their Trine Guided portion of the course

(January-May)

- **Classroom Teacher**
 - Goal: Provide support to students by helping to facilitate Trine course
 - Access to Moodle Course
 - Follow student progress
 - Display videos/lectures posted by Trine faculty
 - Lead in-class discussions
 - Provide 1:1, small group remediation
 - Conducting labs, experiments, and activities as needed
 - Trine faculty has ownership of assessments, content, and grades

Highschool Semester Course Timeline

Fall Semester Begins (August)

- Students are officially registered and enrolled in Trine Course for Term 2 in late October

(August – October)

- **Classroom Teacher**
 - Goal: Prepare students for their DE course by previewing content and learning objectives
 - Access to Moodle Course shell
 - Uses the shell (learning objectives etc.) to create their own locally created version of the class
 - Lectures, assignments, assessments, content, etc.
 - Classroom teacher has ownership of this portion of the course

(October – December)

- Trine Online Term 2 Begins
 - Students start their online portion of the course

(October – December)

- **Classroom Teacher**
 - Goal: Provide support to students by helping to facilitate Trine Online (8-week) course
 - Access to Moodle Course
 - Follow student progress
 - Display videos/lectures posted by Trine faculty
 - Lead in-class discussions
 - Provide 1:1, small group remediation
 - Conducting labs, experiments, and activities as needed
- **Trine Faculty**
 - Has ownership of assessments, content, and grades
 - Can utilize the facilitating teacher to provide support for students day to day

HOW TO BECOME A CONCURRENT ENROLLMENT INSTRUCTOR

New Course & New Instructor:

New Instructor Process

- Fill out an Application
 - Application is reviewed by the department chair, or higher, and approved or denied
 - The application is filled out using the form found on our webpage ([Application Link Here](#))
 - If Approved
 - Liaison will be in touch quickly & they will walk you through the course onboarding before your course starts
 - You will also go through a short onboarding with the Office of Dual Enrollment

Course Registration and Enrollment

- We will visit the school and register students in person (or remotely if that works better for you)
 - Once we have students registered, we can enroll them in the courses

During the Course

- The Liaison will schedule an observation to make sure the course is equitable to what is taught on campus, and will also have opportunities for professional development that is more discipline-specific instead of course-specific (**eligible for IDOE PGP**s)



HOW TO SIGN UP FOR ONLINE COURSES

Dual Enrollment Online Courses:

General Enrollment

- Students are eligible to begin course enrollment requests **sometime in late October - early November and again around late March - early April**
 - Depends on the year when it actually opens up, those a good rule of thumb
- Courses, especially popular ones, go fast so students need to know what they want and request it around this time
 - Sometimes courses are added before the semester, and we will try to get students in
 - But there is no guarantee of getting each student into the courses they want if they request late
 - We will do the best we can to find alternatives.

Course Request Form

- **Best option** to guarantee spots for your students
- We can accommodate 1-29 students, more than 20 students qualifies for the discounted rate
- Once your students are in, courses of less than 25 will be filled in after your students are already in the course
- To request a class simply email the Dual Enrollment Department and we will collect the information from you.

Timelines for Dual Enrollment (DE): Course Request vs. General Enrollment

DE Course Request

- **Fall**
 - Early May, gives us at least 2 ½ month lead time to find a professor for the course in August
- **Spring**
 - Early October, gives us at least 2 ½ month lead time to find a professor for the course in January

Timelines for Dual Enrollment (DE): Course Request vs. General Enrollment

DE General Enrollment

- **Fall**
 - Opens up sometime between the last week in October and the first week in November
- **Spring / Summer**
 - Opens up sometime between the last week in March and the first week in April
- Still accept enrollment requests up to the start week, but cannot guarantee seats

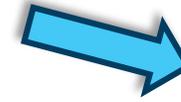


How to Apply

Application: 2 Step Process

- Go to the main page and click on the [Apply Here](#) button or the application page on the side panel

Students **cannot** enroll themselves in courses, that can only be done by Dual Enrollment staff. To enroll in a course, follow the options below:

Dual Enrollment Academic Calendar

- Important Dates
- Be aware of these for the upcoming school year
 - **Fall/Spring Breaks**
 - Keep in mind these dates differ between your local school and Trine
 - **Dropping a Course**
 - There are 2 of these each semester (more for online)
 - One for a full refund and one for no refund
 - Be aware that if you wait too long to drop a course you may not get the full or any refund
 - **Unpaid Bills**
 - Students who have yet to pay their bill will be dropped from their course
 - Caution: This means they will earn a W for the course
 - It will end up on their permanent transcript
