* Boys & Girls State Tuition Award (Must have attended an annual Boys or Girls State)	\$2,000 per year
* Project Lead the Way	\$500 per year
* Pre-physical therapy, pre-medical or pre-physician assistant studies	\$2,000 per year

About Trine University

- 3,124 undergraduates
- 70 percent of undergraduates were from Indiana
- Average gift aid per student was \$19,876
- Average aid from all sources per student was \$27,354
- Trine's Free Application for Federal Student Aid (FAFSA) priority filing deadline is March 1
- School code: 001839



About Trine University undergraduate financial aid

- 96 percent of undergraduate students received financial aid
- 1,509 students received merit scholarships from Trine
- More than \$24 million in scholarship assistance was awarded from Trine resources
- Trine's financial aid budget continued to grow faster than tuition
- 335 students received state grant aid
- 420 students received outside scholarships
- More than \$65 million was awarded from all sources of financial aid: federal, state and institutional — grants, loans, work-study and scholarships

About federal aid delivered to Trine University

- 499 students received Pell grants
- 431 students received federal work-study
- 1,069 students received subsidized William D. Ford direct loans
- 1,137 students received unsubsidized William D. Ford direct loans
- 316 students benefited from parent loans for undergraduate students (PLUS)
