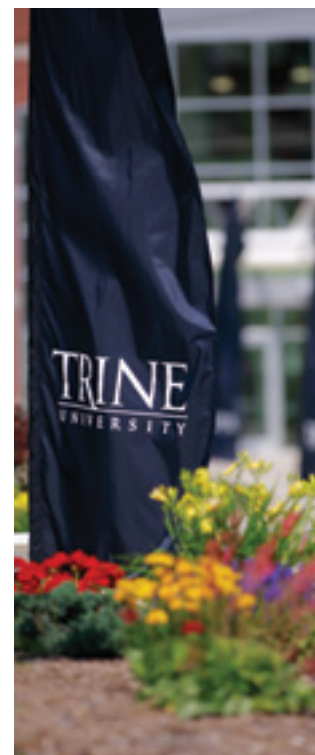

About Trine University undergraduate financial aid

- 94 percent of undergraduate students received financial aid
- 1,771 students received merit scholarships from Trine
- More than \$31 million in scholarship assistance was awarded from Trine resources
- Trine's financial aid budget continued to grow faster than tuition
- 478 students received state grant aid
- 458 students received outside scholarships
- More than \$60 million was awarded from all sources of financial aid: federal, state and institutional — grants, loans, work-study and scholarships

About federal aid delivered to Trine University

- 608 students received Pell grants
- 512 students received federal work-study
- 1,229 students received subsidized William D. Ford direct loans
- 1,321 students received unsubsidized William D. Ford direct loans
- 376 students benefited from parent loans for undergraduate students (PLUS)
